PULAU KUKUP



- Pulau Kukup is a mangrove island located at about 1 km offshore from the 150 year-old fishing village of Kukup in Pontian
- World's Second Largest Uninhabited Mangrove Island
- The area of the island is 6.472 square kilometres and is surrounded by 8 square kilometres of mudflats
- **50% of the world's mangrove species** resides in Pulau Kukup including 12 species of vertebrates and 76 species of birds, including the lesser adjutant stork
- Pulau Kukup's status as a remote hinterland changed in the 1990s when scientists began focusing on the island's biodiversity and unique ecological characteristics.
- The south-west side of the island consists of large areas of mudflats an important food source for birds and other wildlife.

- Pulau Kukup as a Ramsar Site
 - ✓ Granted the status of a "Wetland of International Importance" or RAMSAR Site, by the Geneva-based Ramsar Convention Bureau
 - ✓ 31st January 2003
 - ✓ An example of wetlands; natural & unique
 - ✓ Support vulnerable, endangered species- Lesser Adjutant Stork
 - Support source of food for variety species of flora and fauna
 - \checkmark Support for maintaining rich biodiversity in this region




